## History Foundation 2 — Summer Term Now and then

### **Key Vocabulary**

Then, now, old, new, change, different, dolly tub, mangle, wash day, dolly peg, washing line, washboard, soap and grater, scrubbing brush, iron, , range, kettle, horse and cart, home life, out house, Normanby hall, past

**Range:** ovens, a boiler and hobs around a coal fire which was built into the fireplace.

Kettle: a pot for boiling water in

**Mangle:** two rollers that squeeze water out of washed clothes

**Dolly:** wooden object to pound and stir wet laundry to help clean it

**Dolly peg:** .a wooden clothes peg for hanging clothes on a washing line.

**Wash board:** a board with ridges that clothes are rubbed against with soap to clean them.

**Grater and soap:** metal grater used to break up a bar of soap into flakes for washing.

**Tin bath**: a metal tub placed in front of the fire to wash in and wash clothes in.

**Out house**: an toilet outside the house in a very small building

- Normanby Hall is an important local site

# Key activities that MUST take place

Pre-teach: Polly put the kettle on. Sing the nursery rhyme and look at pictures. Do they think it is old or new? Why? What has changed. Go with their interest, could be clothes or items in the home. Look at other nursery rhymes like Duke of York etc

**Stage 1: H1 Understand chronology** Look at lots of pictures of the home from now and in the past. Children sort the pictures (floor books) and vocalise how they know.

**Stage 2: Build an overview of world history** Life in the past. Watch Magic grandad (quite long so you may want to choose short clips to watch)
