# Reminders

## New School Times

The school day will be extended from September 2023. This is to ensure that your children receive 32.5 hours per week. These new hours are to meet the Government's compulsory time that pupils must spend in school.

### Main School

- 8.30am - The school doors open
- 8.45am - Registration starts at 8.45am prompt  
(this is when the doors close)
- 3.15pm - The school day finishes.

### Nursery

- 8.30am - 11.30am: Morning Session
- 12.15pm- 3.15pm: Afternoon session

Early Bird Club - will still open from 8.00am (£1 per day, per child).



## School Lunch

### The cost of a school meal will be £2.50 in September

The children who are in Year 3 in September will have to start paying for school dinners, unless you qualify for free school meals. You can request an application form to apply for free school meals from the office.

- \* If you do not qualify for free lunches, you will receive an activation code for ParentPay to enable you to pay for lunches. ParentPay is also used to pay for trips so please activate your account even if your child has free lunches.
- \* Please note, meals must be prepaid, if you have a debt of £5.00 (x 2 meals) your child will not be provided with hot meals on that day, an alternative provision will be made.
- \* If you are having difficulties paying for school lunches please talk to us.



### Contact Details

Parents, please ensure that the contact details that we hold in school are up to date.

Should we need to contact you in an emergency, it is imperative that we have your correct telephone number and address.

Also, if you are sending another adult to collect your child, **you must inform the class teacher or the office.**

This year's challenge kicks off with a fantastic free day of open air sports and games for families in Scunthorpe town centre.

The 'Ready, Set, Read' event starts at **12pm on Saturday 15 July outside Scunthorpe Central** and features a crazy mobile tennis court, and a host of sports' day games such as the egg and spoon and sack race and a tug of war!

There will also be family games, entertainment, crafts and sports challenges with prizes.

Children and young people are being encouraged to go along to their local library and register for this year's 'Ready, Set, Read' Summer Reading Challenge.

The theme of the challenge this year – 'Ready, Set, Read!' – is about reading, sport and play, and aims to keep children's minds and bodies active over the summer break.

Children just need to register for the scheme at their local library and read six books over the summer. There are some great rewards to pick up along the way, including rucksacks, frisbees and personal fitness trackers.

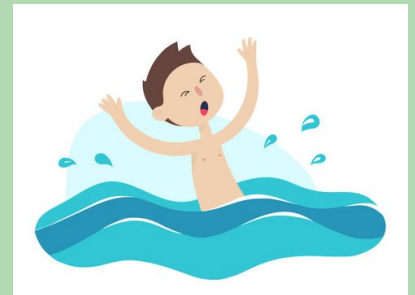

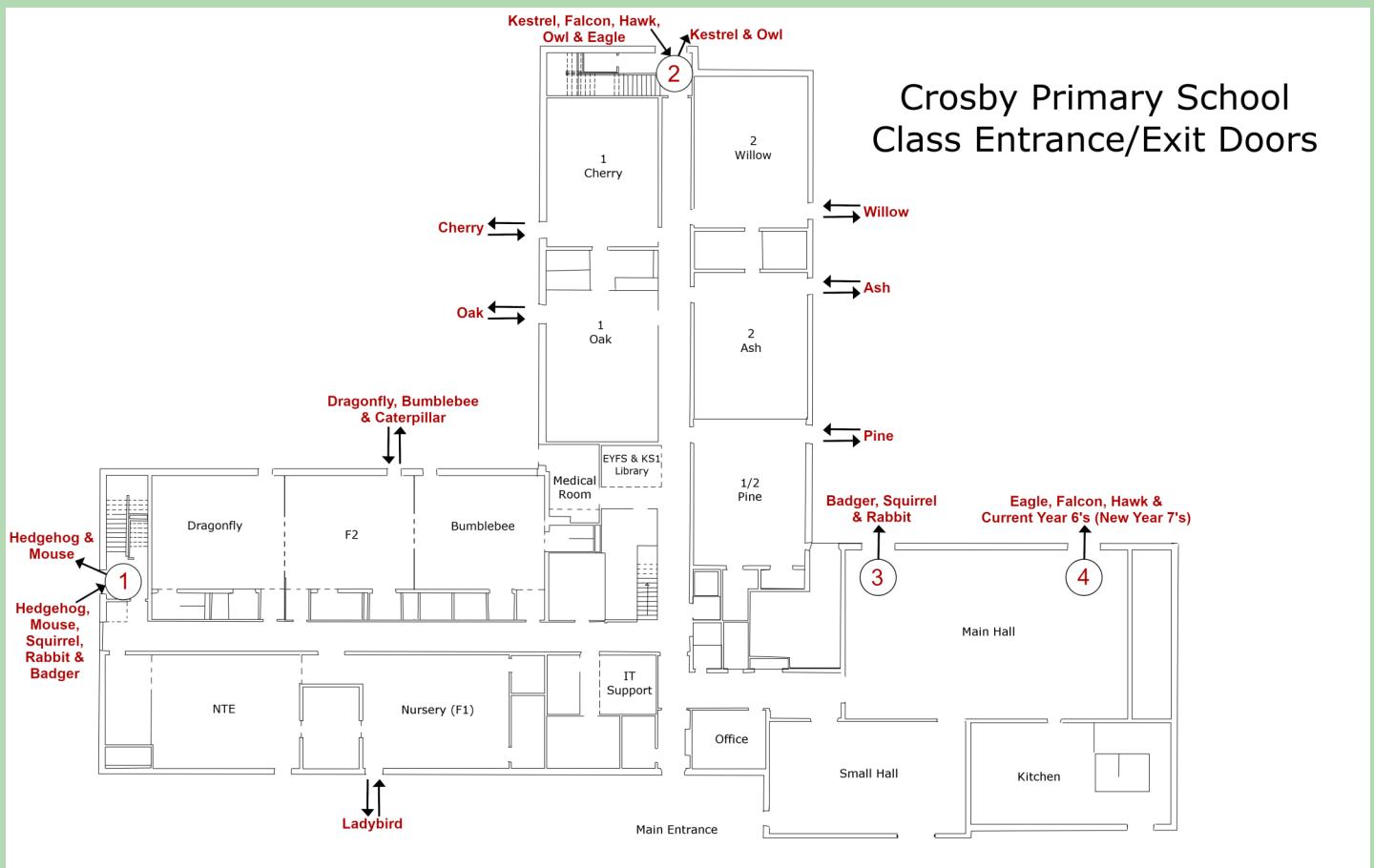
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## Class Entrance and Exit Doors
