

Applying for Secondary School – September 2024 Intake

Dear Parent/Carer

In September 2024 your child is due to transfer to secondary school, and you will need to apply for a school place. You can make your application online by scanning the QR code below and clicking on “Apply for a September 2024 intake place in year 7 at a Secondary School”.

You must only apply to us if you live in North Lincolnshire (NL), even if you want a school outside of North Lincolnshire. If you live somewhere else you must apply to your own council, but can still apply for a NL school through them

Making application

We understand that choosing a school for your child can be a very stressful time. All the secondary schools within North Lincolnshire are holding open events which can help you decide which schools to include on your application, details of the open events can be found on the attached document.

All the open events take place before the application closing date of 31st October 2023.

When you make your application for your child’s school place you will be asked to list up to six schools that you would like your child to attend, these are known as preferences, and you should list them in rank order. Your first preference should be the school you want the most.

When deciding which schools to add to your application you should consider:

- The oversubscription criteria for your preferred school and whether the school was full in previous years.
- Which criteria your child will be placed in for each school
- How you will get your child to school

We have to process all applications under an equal preference system, this means that each preference is ranked against the school’s oversubscription criteria, and this determines how places are allocated. Where we can offer your child a place at more than one school your child will be allocated to the school you have ranked the highest on your application.

Details of each school’s oversubscription criteria can be found on the “Our Schools” page on the council website, this is also linked within the online application.

Children living in a school’s catchment area are more likely to get a place, but this is not guaranteed. We would recommend that you name your catchment school as one of your six preferences so that your child does not miss out on a place at their local school, should we be unable to offer any of your higher preferences.

You can find your catchment school using the “Maps and Data” section on the council website, this is also linked within the online application.

Siblings - If your child has a sibling attending any of your preferred schools you must include them to your application.

Address - The address we use for allocation will be that of the 7th December 2023. For admission purposes, the address is where a child usually lives with their parent or carer.

You must not give the address of a childminder or relative.

Where a child lives with parents with shared responsibility, each for part of the week, the address taken will be that of the parent who claims the child benefit. If neither parent claims child benefit other documentary evidence may be required. If it is found that you have given a false address your child may lose their school place.

Parental Disputes - We can only accept one application for a child. We would encourage parents/carers with shared responsibility to agree their child’s school preferences before an application is made.

If parents/carers cannot agree we may not be able to accept an application without legal documentation, such as a court order, stating which parent/carers has the right to choose the child’s school place.

Home to School Transport - Normally, the Council will only provide transport if your child is attending their catchment or nearest school where the journey between home and school is more than 3 miles. There are exceptions for children from low-income groups where one of their 3 nearest qualifying schools from where they live is more than 2 but less than 6 miles from that school. Private schools or alternative arrangements - You must apply directly to private or independent schools as they are responsible for their own admissions. If you are only seeking a place at a private or independent school or making alternative arrangements, please inform the admissions team as soon as possible.

Children with an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP) - Children who have a EHCP should have an Annual Review prior to them moving to Secondary School. We do ask that parents complete the application naming their preferred school, which will be shared with the SEN team. Notification of allocated place – If you apply online using the dedicated applications portal, and asked for an email, you will receive an email notifying you of the school allocated on the **1st March 2024**.

If you opt to receive a letter or do not apply using the admissions portal, notification of your school place will be posted out on the 1st March 2024 and may take several days to arrive.
