



## **KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE ONLINE THIS CHRISTMAS**

The Online Safety Act was passed in October 2023 with the aim of establishing major new layers of protection for children when they are online. The government has a pledge of a zero tolerance approach to protect children from online harm and the act includes more powerful legislation which should help to safeguard young people in the digital world.

As children get ready to unwrap internet-enabled gadgets on Christmas morning, we encourage you to discuss staying safe online. Mobile phones, tablets and laptops can open up a world of exploration, learning and fun and children should be encouraged to make the most of the benefits. However they also need to be aware that there are risks and dangers to being online, and by working with your children they can learn to safely navigate the internet and social media.

Here are some top tips for keeping safe online:

- Check your child's privacy settings to make sure only approved friends can see posts and images, and warn them about sharing personal information with people they do not know.
- Check if any of the mobile apps they use have location services enabled, and disable this if they do not want to be tracked. Be aware that anyone can track their whereabouts!
- Show them how to report offensive comments or block people who upset them.
  Encourage openness with your children, make sure they know that they can talk to you about any concerns.
- Check 'tagging' settings so that when others are posting or sharing photos online, your child's identity is not revealed.
- Encourage your child to come and talk to you if they see anything that upsets them.
- Ask them to show you which social media apps they use, what they like about them



## **Uniform Reminders**

## **School Uniform:**

- Bottle green school cardigan or jumper
- Yellow or white polo shirt
- Grey or black skirt/pinafore or grey/ black trousers/shorts (not jeans)
- Green and white or yellow and white print summer dress
- Sensible black shoes or boots
- Jewellery one pair of stud earrings and a suitable watch may be worn (not to be worn on PE or swimming days)
- Long hair should be tied back
- No nail varnish
- Head scarves and hair accessories to be plain and school colours (white, black, grey, green or yellow)
- Tights to be plain and school colours



# PE KIT: On PE days your child should come to school wearing their PE kit.

- This should be plain black shorts, full length black leggings or plain black jogging bottoms and a plain white T-shirt.
- Children must continue to wear the green school cardigan / jumper on PE days.
- Trainers are permitted on PE days.
- Please ensure all items are labelled with your child's name and class.
- Remember earrings MUST be removed or covered with plasters before coming to school.

## Well Done!

#### How do we request a Leave of Absence?

Leave of absence must be requested as far in advance as possible (at least 2 weeks) and will only be granted in exceptional circumstances, with the appropriate evidence included. Requests for leave of absence will not be considered retrospectively. The school will consider each application for term-time absence individually. **Please note leave for a 'family holiday' is not considered exceptional and will not be authorised.** Forms are available from the school office staff, who can also help you to complete them. Otherwise you can download and print one from here: Leave of Absence Form.

Leave of absence forms must include a start and end date. Leave will not be considered/granted if a return date is not specified. Should your child not return to school on the confirmed date, the school will attempt contact with parents to ascertain the reason for continued absence. Your child may be removed from roll under the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations (Amendment) 2016.

You would need to re-apply for a school place through the School Admission Team for the Local Authority on your return and a place at Crosby could not be guaranteed. This process will also apply when you have informed the school of your intention to take leave without the completion of a leave request form.

If leave has been requested for an extended amount of time and is unauthorised, then following 10 school days of absence, the school will initiate its Children Missing in Education process and your child may be removed from roll following this, in line with the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations (Amendment) 2016.
