
# Robin Hood's Bay

# Why do we visit Robin Hood's Bay?

It is an opportunity to study in depth a contrasting environment to Crosby. It is a major part of the curriculum and so it is important that ALL children can share the experience. It also supports children's social development and helps develop independence.

## When are we going?

Group 1 Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> September - Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2024

Group 2 Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> September - Friday 27th September 2024

Group 3 Monday 30<sup>th</sup> September - Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2024

Group 4 Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October - Friday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2024

### Who will be taking the children?

There will be 2/3 teachers plus 3/4 other responsible adults in attendance depending on the size of group. The teachers have wide experience of organising and leading parties of children on extended/residential visits.





#### Where do we stay?

Our base is the Old School House Field Study Centre, Fisherhead, Robin Hood's Bay; an establishment which caters for residential visits to the area. Children will sleep in small rooms with bunk beds and will be sharing with other pupils. The centre has a separate dining room and a classroom.



#### What we the children eat?

A full English breakfast will be provided with a packed meal for lunch and a 3 course evening meal (menu to suit children's tastes and will accommodate special dietary needs). Children will need a packed lunch for the first day. Dietary needs are catered for.

# What will we be doing?

This visit is an extension of the classroom. It is not a holiday. The children will be fully occupied and carefully supervised throughout the visit. The following outline programme will give you a flavour of what could be undertaken:

Day 1 Travel to Robin Hood's Bay. Picnic lunch. Town trail-mapping. Settle into the hostel. Evening meal. Night Walk.



Day 2 Robin Hood's Bay studies - homes, survey of amenities, influence of the sea, land use. Sketching. Marine studies (Rock Pooling). Evening meal. Magic Lantern Show.













Day 3 Walk to study coastal erosion and the area around Robin Hood's Bay before travelling home. Packed Lunch. Shopping.

# How much will the visit cost?

The cost of the visit will be **£100.** If your child is entitled to Free School Meals you can use your **£30** credit towards the cost. The cost will cover accommodation, food, travel and insurance. We strongly recommend that regular instalments are paid over the next few months to help ease the burden of this cost. If you would like to pay in instalments please follow the instalment plan on ParentPay. A £10 non-refundable deposit is required by 31<sup>st</sup> January 2024. The full amount is required by Friday 31<sup>st</sup> May 2024.

## How do I make a payment?

As we are a cashless school, we ask that you use our *ParentPay* system to send your contribution.

When you log in you will also be able to:

a) provide consent for your child to take part

b) give details about whether your child will be collected or can walk home afterwards

c) let us know that you wish to use your Educational Visits Credit\* for this visit.

\*Educational Visits Credit - Children who are eligible for Free School Meals / Pupil Premium receive a £30 credit each year to enable them to attend educational visits free of charge. If this applies to you please complete the appropriate section on ParentPay when you register your interest.

If you require any help setting up your ParentPay account, we would be happy to help.

If you have any questions please contact the school office as soon as possible.

We would like all children to take part, as the work for the Autumn half term will focus on Robin Hood's Bay.

What do I need to do to secure my child's place?

Please confirm your willingness for your child to take part by making a non-refundable deposit of £10.00 **by 31<sup>st</sup> January 2024** using ParentPay.

Shortly before the visits happen we will have another meeting to look discuss the final details of the visit, including what the children need to bring with them.
