

Thank you to the school governors and volunteers who came with us and helped to make the visit such a success.

















Crosby Primary School was delighted to host Sir Nic Dakin MP during UK Parliament week.







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
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Willow Making



Lateness

It is a legal requirement that your child is registered at both registrations — morning and afternoon.

If your child misses a registration, the absence remains unauthorised.

Taking your child into school and escorting them is the easiest way to guarantee your child arriving on time.

A child who arrives late will be marked as such on the register. After 9.20am when registers close, any attendance is considered as an unauthorised late.

Class doors open at 8.30am to help children to be punctual. If your child is 15 minutes late each day that would be the same as 10 lost days of schooling each year.
