Get to know the Crosby Staff!

This month we chatted to our Senior Leadership Team, Miss Lumley the Headteacher, Mr Sykes and Miss Bush who are our Deputy Heads. The SLT make strategic decisions in the school to ensure the children get the best education that we can offer, here is what they said:

Miss Lumley



- I have been the Headteacher of Crosby for 2 years—which I love doing, I have been teaching for 24 years.
- * My favourite subject when I was at school was maths.
- When I left school I wanted to be a teacher! I became a teacher because I enjoy seeing children learn and make progress both academically and socially.
- My hours of work are around 8am to 6pm there isn't a typical day but I always greet the children and parents first thing in a morning.
- The best bit about my job is seeing the children, doing our celebration assembly. The most challenging part is remembering everything I have to do!
- * After work to relax, I like to read, I enjoy swimming, cooking, spending time with my son, George and walking my dog, Daisy.

Miss Bush



- I have been Deputy Head for 2 years and teaching for 22 years in total, I have also been the SENCo (special educational needs co-ordinator) since 2016. Altogether I have been at Crosby for 14 years.
- My favourite subject at school was English I love reading.
- * When I left school I wanted be an Educational Psychologist, teaching was part of the qualification but I enjoyed teaching so much I decided to stay in the profession.
- * My hours of work are 7am to 5pm.
- My typical day involves working with children, parents, staff and professionals to ensure the children achieve their potential. The best part of my job is seeing children make progress and achieve their goals, whatever their goals might be.
- * There aren't enough hours in the day to see all the children—I think that is the most challenging part of my job.
- * To relax after a hard day's work, I walk my dog, Poppy and spend time with my two daughters.

Mr Sykes



- I have been teaching for 32 years and Deputy Head for 2 years. When I was a student I used to work in a theatre organising the lighting for shows and I worked in the cinema as a projectionist.
- My favourite subject at school was technical drawing and geography but my favourite subject to teach is maths.
- * When I left school I wanted to be either an Architect, Town Planner or a Teacher.
- My working hours are 8am to 6pm. There are no two days that are the same, I work with children, staff and parents. I look after key stage 2, maths, organise staff training and oversee attendance. I like analysing data, I think they are "excel-lent"!
- * My favourite day is Friday, teaching Owl class. I also enjoy travelling to lots of places "around the world" for Monday's around the world assembly.

Free 'Swap to Stop' drop-ins for smokers

NO booking required - just turn up (you may be asked for a form of ID)

North Lincolnshire Council's Healthy Lifestyles Service are currently delivering a **FREE stop smoking scheme** across venues in Scunthorpe and the surrounding areas.

The scheme consists of giving out a free 'vape starter kit' to all smokers aged 18+ as part of a 'Swap to Stop' Public Health England Incentive.

All that is required is your contact information so that you can be contacted one month after receiving your kit - to check if you have swapped cigarettes for a vape. There would be no further contact unless you needed more information.

Also if the bronze badge winners continue with their excellent 100% attendance, they will have the opportunity to get their silver badge this term.


Vision Education continue to sponsor our attendance awards and have kindly donated some raffle prizes.
